



RAPID stands for Rural Address Property Identification. It serves as the street address for rural properties.

RAPID numbers are based on the distance to your property from the beginning of the road on which it is located.

Although you are not required to purchase a rapid number stake from the Council, it is advisable that you do. The stake uses a reflective sticker which makes the number highly visible at night. Organisations providing emergency services use these numbers as a reference. It is also used by service providers such as Spark and NZ Post.

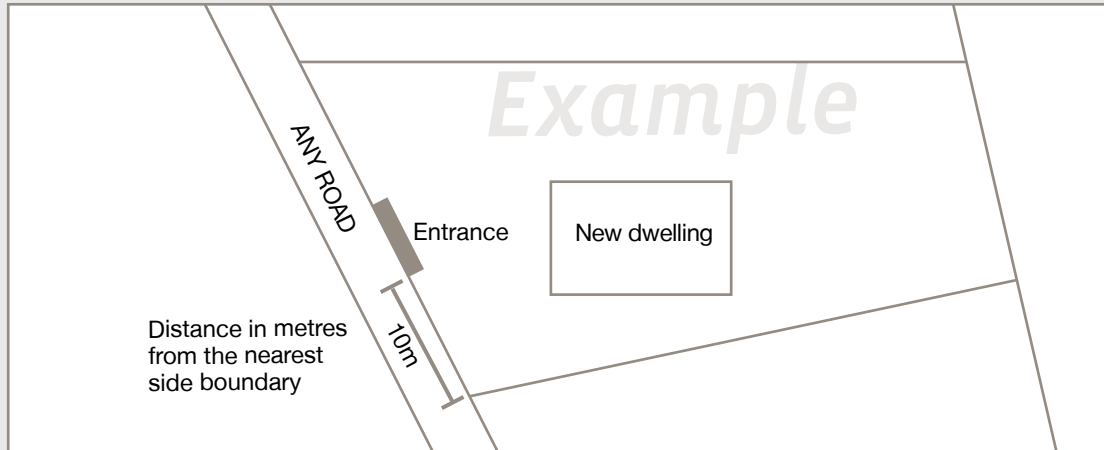

5. Boundary measurements

The Council needs an accurate measurement showing the location of your vehicle entrance.

An example of a site plan is shown below.

- 5a. Attach a site plan to this form showing the following details:
- Distance from the side boundary to the entrance-way.

- 5b. If you don't have a site plan or map of your property, staff at the Civic Centre or the library and service centres in Waitara, Inglewood and Bell Block will be able to assist you. You will need the measurement from the side boundary to the entrance-way.
