Community Boards

Role of community boards (s52 Local Government Act 2002)

- a) represent, and act as an advocate for, the interests of its community; and
- b) consider and report on matters referred by the council and other matters of interest
- c) maintain an overview of services provided by the council within the community; and
- d) prepare an annual submission to the council for expenditure within the community;
- e) communicate with community organisations and special interest groups within the community; and
- f) undertake any other responsibilities that are delegated to it by the territorial authority.

Addressing the community board

Members of the public have an opportunity to address a community board during the public forum section or as a deputation.

A public forum section of up to 30 minutes precedes all community board meetings. Each speaker during the public forum section of a meeting may speak for up to 10 minutes. In the case of a group a maximum of 20 minutes will be allowed.

A request to make a *deputation* should be made to the secretariat within two working days before the meeting. The chairperson will decide whether your deputation is accepted. The chairperson may approve a shorter notice period. No more than four members of a deputation may address a meeting. A limit of 10 minutes is placed on a speaker making a presentation. In the case of a group a maximum of 20 minutes will be allowed.

Purpose of Local Government

The reports contained in this agenda address the requirements of the Local Government Act 2002 in relation to decision making. Unless otherwise stated, the recommended option outlined in each report meets the purpose of local government and:

- Will help meet the current and future needs of communities for good-quality local infrastructure, local public services, and performance of regulatory functions in a way that is most cost-effective for households and businesses;
- Would not alter significantly the intended level of service provision for any significant activity undertaken by or on behalf of the Council, or transfer the ownership or control of a strategic asset to or from the Council.

The Inglewood Community board would like to speak to their submission and have a timeslot of 15 minutes.

Community Park for Inglewood

The Inglewood Community Board would like to see the establishment of a Community Park which has been designed in consultation with the Inglewood Community included in the LTP 2015-2025. The Community Board support the need for Jubilee Park – Elliot Street to be upgraded with the following:

1. Upgraded skate park
2. Public toilet for park users
3. Playground

The skate park is now 30 years old and does not meet the expectations of the community. It needs to be brought up to a standard that allows users of all ages from 2 years and up.

The current playground equipment does not cater for older children and as part of the community park concept it does need to cater for all ages.

Jubilee Park has the potential to be a community park with facilities to cater for all ages and as such, is also in need of a public toilet. The Community Board request that this be budgeted in the LTP 2015-2025.

Windsor Walkway – Circuit Footpath

The Inglewood Community Board request planning and budgeting be undertaken to put a footpath around the unpaved section of the circuit. There are some sections that make it difficult for users of this popular walkway, as they are required to walk on the road which can be unsafe for cars and walkers. The Board requests that work be completed progressively with completion of the whole project to occur by 2025.

Joe Gibbs and PG Nops Reserves

Inglewood Community Board requests that the Council retain the current management of these Reserves in the short term. As per the deliberations on the last Long Term Plan, the Board request that these Reserves be included in investigations to be undertaken in conjunction with the Green Corridors Reserves Management Plan which will look at the management and any future development. The community are asking for the removal of the fence at Joe Gibbs Reserve and the development of an open space park.

The current level of service predominately involves track maintenance in the bush remnant, grazing of the open area, mowing of the front section, as well as noxious animal and pest management.

The Inglewood Community Board requests that consideration of a campervan parking area at the Joe Gibbs Reserve be included in the development of the Green Corridors Reserves Management Plan.

Egmont Village

The Inglewood Community Board request that consideration for planning and budgeting for a reticulated water supply and sewerage system for Egmont Village be considered.
