## **Community Boards**

### **Role of community boards (s52 Local Government Act 2002)**

- a) represent, and act as an advocate for, the interests of its community; and
- b) consider and report on matters referred by the council and other matters of interest
- c) maintain an overview of services provided by the council within the community; and
- d) prepare an annual submission to the council for expenditure within the community;
- e) communicate with community organisations and special interest groups within the community; and
- f) undertake any other responsibilities that are delegated to it by the territorial authority.

### **Addressing the community board**

Requests for public forum and deputations need to be made at least one day prior to the meeting. The Chairperson has authority to approve or decline public comments and deputations in line with the standing order requirements.

#### Public Forum

Public Forums enable members of the public to bring matters to the attention of the committee which are not contained on the meeting agenda. The matters must relate to the meeting's terms of reference. Speakers can speak for up to 5 minutes, with no more than two speakers on behalf of one organisation.

#### Deputations

Deputations enable a person, group or organisation to speak to the meeting on matters contained on the agenda. An individual speaker can speak for up to 10 minutes. Where there are multiple speakers for one organisation, a total time limit of 15 minutes, for the entire deputation, applies.

### **Purpose of Local Government**

The reports contained in this agenda address the requirements of the Local Government Act 2002 in relation to decision making. Unless otherwise stated, the recommended option outlined in each report meets the purpose of local government and:

- Will help meet the current and future needs of communities for good-quality local infrastructure, local public services, and performance of regulatory functions in a way that is most cost-effective for households and businesses;
- Would not alter significantly the intended level of service provision for any significant activity undertaken by or on behalf of the Council, or transfer the ownership or control of a strategic asset to or from the Council.

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## **INGLEWOOD COMMUNITY BOARD LONG-TERM PLAN 2018-2028**

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### **PURPOSE**

This report advises of the Inglewood Community Board submission to the Long-Term Plan 2018-2028.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

**That, having considered all matters raised in the report, the Inglewood Community Board forward their submission to the Council's Long-Term Plan 2018-2028 for their consideration.**

### **SUBMISSION**

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The Inglewood Board would like to speak to their submission.

1. The Board endorses the following items included in the current plans
  - a) The water quality improvements for Inglewood planned in years 1 & 2
  - b) The approach to NZTA to look at the pedestrian crossings in Inglewood and the SH3 intersections with Durham, Dudley and Lepper Roads.

2. **Walkways/cycle ways**

The Board and Inglewood Community future aspirations keenly support walkways and cycle ways as detailed in the Inglewood Community Board plan 2016-2019

P.G Nops and Joe Gibbs reserves, to Trimble Park walkway/viewing point and ending at Jubilee Park is a wonderful example of the potential quality cycle/walkways that would be a significant asset to the Community of Inglewood. We also see that it is important to continue to develop the Inglewood Windsor walkway to a safe standard with linkage to the two reserves and park. This walkway is well utilised and supported by the Inglewood Community.

An investment has already been made to begin these pathways and it is vital for best return on that and future investment that the work is completed. We would therefore recommend that further planning and budgeting is undertaken to complete the Windsor Walkway over an agreed number of years.

## Item for Decision

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This project aligns perfectly with the Destination Playground and Skate Park work and The Lions Mini Putt project that is currently underway and adds to Inglewood becoming a key satellite destination of New Plymouth.

### 3. **Campground/Dump station**

The Inglewood Board request that further planning and budgeting be undertaken to find a suitable location for a Self-contained camping area to accommodate the increasing freedom camping tourism market and seek to provide more accommodation options for visitors

Currently plans are in place for a dump station to be created on Humphries street.

### 4. **Swimming Pool**

The Inglewood swimming pool is open from mid-November to late March (4½ months) with approximately 9,000 users per annum. The Inglewood Community Board requests that the Council plan and budget for solar heating for the Inglewood pool and spectator sun respite shading. Heating of the Inglewood pool was one of the key aspirations requested in the Inglewood Community Board 30 Year Blueprint plan.

Usage of the pool has grown with the decommissioning of the Inglewood High School pool and Inglewood Primary School using the pool for swimming lessons during the first term.

Heating the pool will make a more comfortable environment for those using the pool and creates a positive water experience which would increase users to the pool.

Being located in the destination park hub could also see an increase in users to the pools in future and open opportunities to include a waterpark during the summer period.

All items noted in this submission are supported by the Inglewood Community Board Plan 2016-2019 for which community engagement was undertaken in 2016/2017. Items 2-4 above are in line with the Council key directions of: Communities, Citizens and Destination and add value to the Health and well-being of the Inglewood community.
