1. Inglewood Community Board Long-Term Plan 2018-2028 Submission

Resolved:

That, having considered and discussed all matters raised in the submission, the Inglewood Community board forward their submission to the Council's Long-term Plan 2018-2028 for their consideration.

Committee Adviser note: For clarification the Boards submission reads as follows:

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The Inglewood Board would like to speak to their submission.

1. The Board endorses the following items included in the current plans
 - a) The water quality improvements for Inglewood planned in years 1 & 2
 - b) The approach to NZTA to look at the pedestrian crossings in Inglewood and the SH3 intersections with Durham, Dudley and Lepper Roads.

2. **Walkways/cycle ways**

The future aspirations of the Board and Inglewood Community keenly support walkways and cycle ways as detailed in the Inglewood Community Board plan 2016-2019.

P.G Nops and Joe Gibbs reserves, to Trimble Park walkway/viewing point and ending at Jubilee Park is a wonderful example of the potential quality cycle/walkways that would be a significant asset to the Community of Inglewood. We also see that it is important to continue to develop the Inglewood Windsor walkway to a safe standard with linkage to the two reserves and park. This walkway is well utilised and supported by the Inglewood Community.

An investment has already been made to begin these pathways and it is vital for best return on that and future investment that the work is completed. We would therefore recommend that further planning and budgeting is undertaken to complete the Windsor Walkway over an agreed number of years.

This project aligns perfectly with the Destination Playground and Skate Park work and possible BMX track. The Lions Mini Golf project that is currently proposed adds to Inglewood becoming a key satellite destination of New Plymouth.

3. **Campground/Dump station**

The Inglewood Community Board request that the Joe Gibbs Reserve be recognised as a suitable location for a self-contained camping area.

The Inglewood Community Board endorses the current plans that are in place for a dump station to be created on Humphries Street which would include a fresh water supply.

4. **Swimming Pool**

The Inglewood swimming pool is open from mid-November to late March (4½ months) with approximately 9,000 users per annum. The Inglewood Community Board requests that the Council plan and budget for solar heating for the Inglewood pool and spectator sun respite shading. Heating of the Inglewood pool was one of the key aspirations requested in the Inglewood Community Board 30 Year Blueprint plan.

Usage of the pool has grown with the decommissioning of the Inglewood High School pool. The Inglewood Primary School uses the pool for swimming lessons during the first term.

Heating the pool will make a more comfortable environment for those using the pool and creates a positive water experience which would increase users to the pool. Being located in the destination park hub could also see an increase in users to the pools in future and open opportunities to include a waterpark during the summer period.

All items noted in this submission are supported by the Inglewood Community Board Plan 2016-2019 for which community engagement was undertaken in 2016/2017. Items 2-4 above are in line with the Council key directions of: Communities, Citizens and Destination and add value to the Health and well-being of the Inglewood community.
