Dear Ken,

I understand you have a meeting in Tikorangi tomorrow? Could you and other councillors maybe have a look at the state of the roads here, particularly Otaraoa and Inland North which have seen the largest number of very heavy vehicles recently and are showing it? I contacted NPDC today about a dangerous pothole across the road from the school where Ngatimaru turns to Inland North. We hit it last night and worried that it may have taken out one of our car tyres. Tonight it claimed a victim - a cyclist friend on his way out here. It appears he has a broken hip. As Mark stood along there, waiting for the ambulance to arrive, he was talking to other locals and at least two other complaints have gone in to Council from others about the same pothole.

Will it take a broken hip, possible other injuries and extensive damage to a very valuable road bike to get action from Council? Or will we have to wait until something worse happens?

The latest vehicle count by Council shows a 50% increase in heavy traffic since the preceding count - which was taken at a time of peak petrochemical activity in 2013 (which is why traffic counts were taken at that time). I do not understand why Todd Energy are not being levied substantially more to pay for the road damage from their many and heavy loads. The road damage costs should not be a charge on ratepayers.
