Community Boards

Role of community boards (s52 Local Government Act 2002)

- a) represent, and act as an advocate for, the interests of its community; and
- b) consider and report on matters referred by the council and other matters of interest
- c) maintain an overview of services provided by the council within the community; and
- d) prepare an annual submission to the council for expenditure within the community;
- e) communicate with community organisations and special interest groups within the community; and
- f) undertake any other responsibilities that are delegated to it by the territorial authority.

Addressing the community board

Members of the public have an opportunity to address a community board during the public forum section or as a deputation.

A public forum section of up to 30 minutes precedes all community board meetings. Each speaker during the public forum section of a meeting may speak for up to 10 minutes. In the case of a group a maximum of 20 minutes will be allowed.

A request to make a *deputation* should be made to the secretariat within two working days before the meeting. The chairperson will decide whether your deputation is accepted. The chairperson may approve a shorter notice period. No more than four members of a deputation may address a meeting. A limit of 10 minutes is placed on a speaker making a presentation. In the case of a group a maximum of 20 minutes will be allowed.

Purpose of Local Government

The reports contained in this agenda address the requirements of the Local Government Act 2002 in relation to decision making. Unless otherwise stated, the recommended option outlined in each report meets the purpose of local government and:

- Will help meet the current and future needs of communities for good-quality local infrastructure, local public services, and performance of regulatory functions in a way that is most cost-effective for households and businesses;
- Would not alter significantly the intended level of service provision for any significant activity undertaken by or on behalf of the Council, or transfer the ownership or control of a strategic asset to or from the Council.

Inglewood is serviced by three children's playgrounds. The main playground at Jubilee Park on Elliot Street and two secondary playgrounds which have limited equipment.

The playground at Jubilee Park has climbing equipment and a skate bowl of sorts. The skate bowl is a half pipe constructed of ply timber which was replaced a few years back. It is known as *Splinter Gully* by the children who use it for the simple reason of the ply splinters. There is no challenge to the half pipe and it has out grown its use by date.

The climbing equipment is designed for toddlers to 11/12 year olds. There is no climbing equipment to challenge this older group.

The children in their early teen years have nothing to challenge them.

There is a group of children in Inglewood, supported by adults, who wish to see a new skate park and have been considering raising the funds for this themselves.

At one of the District Council community consultation meetings, a resident from Elliot Street asked for toilets to be constructed at Jubilee Park near the playground as the resident had been approached by various mothers who had young children that needed to go to the toilet and there is no public toilets available. Young children being toilet trained need to 'go' there and then and not wait to be taken home.

Toilets could also be used by visitors to the cemetery which is nearby.
